We will once again be visited by our friends from Nanjing #12 school in China this winter. The 24 students and 2 adults will arrive in Virginia on Friday, January 27, 2012. They will attend classes at BRHS from January 30 through February 1.

BRHS is trying to organize a return trip to China for our students over the 2012 Spring Break (March 31-April 8). If you are interested, please contact Mr. Anderson (doug.anderson@lcps.org). This trip will visit the cities of Beijing (Beijing School #22, Forbidden City, Great Wall), Xian (Terracotta Warriors), and Shanghai before returning home. The cost per student estimate is roughly \$2600-\$2800. This includes flight, hotel, meals, and tickets for historical sites.

Winter break is over and we have begun 2012, but we are still in the second quarter. This quarter is often hard for students because of all the starting and stopping that occurs with the Thanksgiving and Winter break. We are running late busses on Tuesdays and Wednesdays at 5:15. Administrative Information

In an effort to allow for more access/communication, all Loudoun County Public Schools have gone to the CLARITY online grade book and attendance system. Currently there are only a handful of pilot schools (BRHS, FWMS) that have opened the online portal for parents. If you have not signed up to receive your user ID and password please download the form from our website (or come to the school and get one from our Guidance Dept.), fill it out and send it in to the BRHS Guidance department. This program allows you to check your son or daughter's grades and attendance online at anytime. It also has the capability to send you emails about his or her grades and attendance if you choose to activate that feature. We currently have roughly over 900 parents signed up for this system. I am hopeful that we will be able to give our students access this year during the second semester.

Monday, January 23 is a teacher workday and students will not be at school. The 3rd quarter will begin on Tuesday, January 24.

The Winter One Acts are coming this January. The shows will take place on Saturday, January 21.

If AP Exam payments are not paid by **January 13** students will forfeit the extra weighted quality points added to their cumulative GPA.

Application Details

- Most regular applications are due between January 1 and February 15. Keep copies of everything you send to colleges.

- Contact colleges to make sure they've received all application materials. Financial Aid: Apply Early. Apply Right.
- You and your family should save 2011 pay stubs to estimate income on aid forms that you'll file in early 2012.
- Submit your FAFSA as soon after January 1 as possible. You must first request a pin before submitting your FAFSA. Visit www.pin.ed.gov to attain a pin. Then you can complete your FAFSA at www.fafsa.ed.gov BEWARE of phony sites, such as www.fafsa.com which require application fees.
- Men 18 or older must register for the selective service to receive federal financial aid. For more information on Selective Service, visit www.sss.gov
- Many priority financial aid deadlines fall in February. To get the most attractive award package, apply by the priority date. Keep copies of everything you send.
