- Equivalent to a 1 semester college German course
- May earn college credit with an AP exam score of 3, 4, or 5
- Students should have successfully completed German 5 (exceptions may be made for rising seniors who have excelled in German 4)

## Course Themes

The AP German Language and Culture course is structured around six themes:

- Beauty and Aesthetics
- Contemporary Life
- Families and Communities
- Global Challenges
- Personal and Public Identities
- Science and Technology

Themes facilitate the integration of language, content, and culture and promote the use of the language in a variety of contexts. The themes may be combined, as they are interrelated.

## Assignments:

- Frequent computer use outside of class expected
- Read authentic texts & discuss
- Research projects & presentations
- Current events

## Assessments:

- Frequent quizzes
- Group work & projects
- Individual work & projects
- Tests timed & modeled after the AP exam
- Socratic Seminars and Debates

- Listening to/reading German every day (beyond class materials)
- A lot of vocabulary
- Pre-course summer assignment

## AP Exam:

- Given in May; 3.5 hours long
- Section I : 65 multiple choice questions
- Section II : Free Response; 4 prompts

## AP German Language and Culture course overview:

The AP German Language and Culture course emphasizes communication (understanding and being understood by others) by applying interpersonal, interpretive, and presentational skills in real-life situations. This includes vocabulary usage, language control, communication strategies, and cultural awareness. The AP German Language and Culture course strives not to overemphasize grammatical accuracy at the expense of communication. To best facilitate the study of language and culture, the course is taught almost exclusively in German. The AP German Language and Culture course engages students in an exploration of culture in both contemporary and historical contexts. The course develops students' awareness and appreciation of cultural products (e.g., tools, books, music, laws, conventions, institutions); practices (patterns of social interactions within a culture); and perspectives (values, attitudes, and assumptions).
