

You need to sign up for : Remind.com and Google Classroom. See information on back for sign up information

There are **TWO** parts:

- a written description about the exam itself (see part I)
- a video **OR** scrapbook (see part II)

I. Ensayo del examen: Due August 1. Upload to Google Classroom.

Go to the AP website for the Spanish Language Exam and learn everything you can about the exam: format, scoring, length, date, etc.

http://apcentral.collegeboard.com/apc/public/exam/exam_information/4554.html. There are several links to exam format, sample questions and audios, general information.

Upload to GC a 150 words minimum written word document **in English** that explains what you have learned about the exam and what parts of the test you think will be the hardest for you. Include some strategies for how you will prepare yourself for the course and ultimately for the test. **DO NOT COPY AND PAST FROM THE WEBSITE** – reflect on the exam format and on your strengths and weaknesses in Spanish. **Due in GC: August 1st. This is worth 100 points.**

II. Summer Memories: Due the first week of school. Upload to Google Classroom.

- **Throughout the summer**, document your activities. **Pick A or B.**
- - a. Create a scrapbook with souvenirs and memories from the people and events from your summer. Your scrapbook either may be in paper form or digitized in a format that can be presented in school. (I recommend either Google Slides or Prezi). The scrapbook should have a title and should contain a minimum of 4-5 different images or memorabilia.
 - OR:
 - b. Create a one-minute video that is a collection of clips from your summer. Each video clip should be between 2-5 seconds long. You should have a title in the open. Your video must an .mp4 file.

You will be presenting your Summer Memories in an interpersonal speaking format presentation during the opening days of school. You will show your video OR scrapbook and students in the class will ask you questions about it. Expect that to last between 2-3 minutes, so be sure to be familiar with the grammar and vocabulary you will need to discuss what is in your picture montage. **Upload to Google Classroom Summer. Everyone must turn it in by the first week of class** and then a presentation schedule will be established. **(100 points total book/video and speaking presentation).**
