#### Letter from the Principal

Algonkian Families,

I want to wish our entire community a Happy New Year! I hope you enjoyed the holidays and had a chance to relax and enjoy your family.

The second quarter ends on January 23<sup>rd</sup>. Reports cards will be sent home on February 4<sup>th</sup>. Mid-Year assessments in math and reading will take place at the end of January to assess the progress made this year by each of our students.

Students continue to do a fantastic job with getting to school on time. Please make sure you keep up the good routines to ensure students are here on time. There is always the chance of inclement weather in January, so please see our website for procedures when there is a delay.

When dropping off students by car in the mornings you do not need to wait until the crosswalk to let them out. Once you make it around the turn and see the cones, you can let your child out. This helps prevent backups and keeps the line of cars moving.

I would like to introduce Ms. Kaarin Chavez as our new second grade teacher. We are happy to have Ms. Chavez be a part of our Algonkian family and she is excited to be here.

Math facts are an important foundational skill for most topics in math. The school purchased Reflex math and students use it at school to improve their math fact skills. Reflex math is a web based program, so students can access it from home. I suggest students work on it at home once or twice a week. I am going to challenge the students in January to do a certain amount of facts and will give them an incentive to reach their goal. Currently student have answered 1.2 million facts, my goal is to raise that to 1.5 million by the end of January.

#### 5th Grade

Students will have practice with online questions and tools prior to the testing days. The students will complete a practice test from February 3<sup>rd</sup>-February 5th. On February 9<sup>th</sup> – February 11<sup>th</sup>, students will complete the CogAT assessment.

Algonkian's PBIS framework is based on The 3 R's Respect Responsibility Relationships

Why is it so important to focus on teaching positive social behaviors?

Answer: Focusing on being proactive and positive works best!

In the past, school-wide discipline has focused mainly on reacting to specific student misbehavior. Research has shown that modeling, and reinforcing positive social behavior are important steps of a student's educational experience. Proactively teaching behavioral expectations and rewarding students for following them is a much more effective approach than waiting for misbehavior to occur before responding. The purpose of school-wide PBIS is to establish a climate in which appropriate behavior is the norm.

Don't forget that the key to PBIS is POSITIVES!

More attention when children are doing what you want them to do!

Less attention when children are not!


