

# **TRAILSIDE** Fall Clubs 2019

Trailside Middle School is pleased to kick off our after school clubs!

Activities will begin the week of September 24, 2019 and meet weekly for eight weeks. The cost is \$80 per student per club. Students are permitted to enroll in multiple clubs at the time of registration if the clubs are held on different meeting days.

Clubs start immediately after school and end at 4:23. Activity buses are available on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays during club sessions. If a student is within walking distance, they may walk home with parental permission. For information on the Activity Bus schedule, please visit the school website. Car riders must be picked up by 4:30.

**PAYMENT INFORMATION:** An option to pay online is available, or checks should be made payable to Trailside Middle School and should be remitted by your student to their respective house secretary. Payments for clubs must be made in full prior to the start of the club. There will be no refunds once a child is placed into a club. Spots in clubs are not reserved until payment is received. Please complete the Application for Reduction or Waiver of Fees when appropriate, and have your child submit to their respective house secretary.

**MAKE-UP POLICY:** After-school clubs will not be held if Loudoun County Public Schools are closed. Every effort will be made to schedule a make-up class.

**REMINDERS FROM THE SCHOOL HEALTH CLINIC:** School-Sponsored After-School Activities and Sports- If your child has diabetes, an epinephrine auto-injector, an inhaler, or other emergency medication at school, please notify the teacher/sponsor that your child has the health concern. Also, notify the health clinic assistant/nurse 1-2 weeks prior to the event. The clinic is closed after dismissal and the nurse/health clinic assistant is not in the building. Arrangements need to be made to have medication available and to train staff. It is strongly suggested that middle and high school students carry their own inhaler and/or epinephrine auto-injector for quick access to medication. For students to carry an inhaler, the physician must complete and sign the "Asthma Action Plan," form 11:14, giving his/her permission for the student to carry the inhaler, and the parent and student must sign the "Parent/Student Agreement for Permission to Carry an Inhaler," form 11:14b. For students with an epinephrine auto-injector, the physician will need to sign the bottom of form 11:10 and the parent and student will need to sign form 11:10c under "Agreement for Permission to Self-Administer and/or Carry Epinephrine." For students with diabetes to carry any of their medical supplies, the diabetes form, Part 4: "Permission to Self-Carry and Self-Administer Diabetes Care," needs to be signed by the physician, parent and student.
