

### **9<sup>th</sup> Grade Grading Policy**

**Physical Education:** Physical education makes up 50% of your grade. Each day the students can be awarded up to 20 points. The students are required to dress out each day. Students must wear athletic shoes that tie, socks, shorts, and a t-shirt. Grading will be based on the five standards of health and physical education.

**Health:** Health makes up the 50% of the grade. Each assignment, project, and test will have a point value totaled for the student's grade. The point value will be given with the assignment. The student must be prepared for class with all materials and a positive learning attitude. NO assignment will account for more than 20% of the overall grade.

Passing the CPR portion of 9<sup>th</sup> grade health is a state requirement for graduation. Students must pass a written exam in both CPR and First Aid with a score of 80%. A grade of Pass/Not Pass will be given to the student as a separate score on their transcript.

### **10<sup>th</sup> Grade Grading Policy**

**Physical Education:** Physical education makes up 50% of your grade. Each day the students can be awarded up to 20 points. The students are required to dress out each day. Students must wear athletic shoes that tie, socks, shorts, and a t-shirt. Grading will be based on the five standards of health and physical education.

**Drivers Education/Health:** Drivers education will make up 50% of the HPE10 grade for the 1<sup>st</sup> Semester. Drivers education will also consist of its own grade at the end of the semester. Students will take a required written final exam for Drivers Education. Students will receive a Pass/Not Pass grade on their transcript. Health will make up the 50% of the grade for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester. Each assignment, project, and test will have a point value totaled for the student's grade. The point value will be given with the assignment. The student must be prepared for class with all materials and a positive learning attitude. No assignment will account for more than 20% of the overall grade
