| Make Up Work (Absences) <br> Students who are absent will be given a <br> reasonable amount of time, consistent with <br> the length of the absence, to turn in missing <br> work. Teachers are not required to provide <br> work in advance of a planned absence. | Student Responsibility <br> When you are absent, review <br> Student VUE and ask about any <br> assignments you may have <br> missed. | Teachers are available to <br> answer any questions <br> about assignments or tests <br> that a student missed. <br> Teachers are available <br> during resource time to <br> provide support. 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| Academic Dishonesty <br> In an instance of academic dishonesty in | Student Responsibility | Teacher Support |
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| which a student copies, plagiarizes or turns in work that is not his or her own. The student is expected to re-do the assignment or may be given an alternate assignment. Each incident will also receive a discipline referral. | - Turn in your own work. <br> - Follow rules concerning plagiarism. <br> - If you have a question about using a source, ask the teacher. | Teachers provide guidelines for using sources during instruction. Lessons are also provided when students visit the library. |


| Missing \& Late Work |
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| Students have 10 instructional days from the |
| original due date to turn in any late work. |
| Work turned in late will not receive a |
| score higher than $80 \%$. A " $Z$ " posted in |
| the gradebook shows that work is |
| missing. After the final deadline, late |
| work will no longer be accepted, and the |
| student will receive a score of o for the |
| assignment. |


| Student Responsibility | Teacher Support |
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| Turn in work on time. | Teachers update gradebooks <br> every 10 days and will post <br> due dates in Phoenix/Google <br> Classroom when assignment <br> information is posted. |

## Retakes

Students can retake a summative assessment (worth $10 \%$ or more of the quarter grade) to demonstrate mastery. To be eligible, the score must be between $79 \%-69 \%$. For students scoring below 70\%, a retake is required.

## Student Responsibility <br> Teacher Support

- Be prepared to do well on the original date. Most students earn the highest grade, the first time taking an assessment.
- Participate in re-teach/review session.
- If you earned between 79-70, you must specifically request a retake.
- If you earned below 70\%, you are required to meet your teacher and retake the assessment.

Teachers are available during the day or after school hours for extra help with students. Teachers will follow up with students miss opportunities for review/re-teaching and/or a retake.

| $\begin{aligned} & A+=98-100 \\ & A=93-97 \\ & A-=90-92 \\ & \hline \end{aligned}$ | An "A" generally designates the status of a student who consistently demonstrates accurate and complete knowledge of content and competencies specified in the course curriculum and applies that knowledge in a variety of settings. |
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| $\begin{aligned} & B+=87-89 \\ & B=83-86 \\ & B-=80-82 \end{aligned}$ | $A$ " $B$ " generally designates the status of a student who demonstrates knowledge of content and competencies specified in the course curriculum with some improvement needed in accuracy and/or consistency in performance and applying that knowledge in a variety of settings. |
| $\begin{aligned} & C+=77-79 \\ & C=73-76 \\ & C-=70-72 \end{aligned}$ | A "C" generally designates the status of a student who demonstrates knowledge of basic content and competencies specified in the course curriculum but requires additional practice and instructional experiences to acquire skills necessary to apply that knowledge in a variety of settings. |
| $\begin{aligned} & D+=67-69 \\ & D=63-66 \\ & D-=60-62 \end{aligned}$ | A "D" generally designates the status of a student who needs significant practice and instructional interventions to acquire the knowledge of basic content and competencies specified in the course curriculum necessary to apply that knowledge in a variety of settings. |
| $F=0-59 \text { or }$ lower | An "F" generally designates the status of a student who has not demonstrated the basic knowledge of content and/or competencies specified in the course curriculum and requires additional practice and instructional interventions in order to succeed. |
| $G=$ Not Graded | The course is not graded: resource, math lab, Spectrum, etc. |
| I = Incomplete | The student is missing significant work and a grade cannot be assigned. An Incomplete grade must be changed to an appropriate letter grade after two weeks. |
