All nominees must have <u>completed</u> a **minimum of five years**' experience as a principal, **three of which must be** IN LOUDOUN COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS, at the time of nomination.

NOMINATION CRITERIA: Nominees must be principals who:

- Manage effectively.
- 2. Demonstrate and encourage creativity and innovation.
- 3. Foster cooperation between the school and the community.
- 4. Maintain a continuing dialogue with students and parents as well as faculty and staff.
- 5. Keep abreast of developments in the field of education.
- 6. Encourage team spirit.
- 7. Demonstrate leadership and exemplify commitment.
- 8. Continue to play an active role in the classroom.
- 9. Commit to fostering deeper learning through empowering all students to make meaningful contributions to the world (new for 2018-2019).
- 10. Maintain their position as principal throughout the 2019-2020 school year.

As the NOMINATOR you must include with this form the following materials:

- A minimum of four statements of support (a maximum of eight), one of which must be by a
  professional educator
- A career summary/resume of the nominee
- A description of contributions, made by the nominee, in the above nomination criteria
- A 200-word biography, written to highlight the specific award for which the awardee was nominated

## The Washington Post Principal of the Year Award

Most educators will agree that the level of excellence a school achieves is directly related to the level of leadership provided by its principal. It is the combination of the principal's ability to manage, their interest in staff and students, their respect for learning and vision of the future that set the stage for the school's efforts to educate our children. The Washington Post Principal of the Year Award seeks to recognize those principals who go beyond the day-to-day demands of their position to create an exceptional educational environment. In presenting this award, The Washington Post hopes to encourage excellence in school leadership and to contribute in a substantive way to the improvement of education in the Washington metropolitan area.

### **Eligibility**

Nominees must be full-time principals (in grades prekindergarten through 12) in an accredited school in one of the jurisdictions listed below. Each nominee must have completed a minimum of five years' experience as a principal, three of which must be in the school or school system in which he or she is currently serving.

- District of Columbia
- Maryland: Anne Arundel, Calvert, Charles, Frederick, Howard, Montgomery, Prince George's and St. Mary's Counties
- **Virginia:** Alexandria, Arlington, Fairfax, Falls Church, Fauquier, Loudoun, Manassas, Manassas Park, Prince William and Stafford Counties

## **Nomination Criteria**

Nominees must be principals who:

- 1. Manage effectively.
- 2. Demonstrate and encourage creativity and innovation.
- 3. Foster cooperation between the school and the community.
- 4. Maintain a continuing dialogue with students and parents as well as faculty and staff.
- 5. Keep abreast of developments in the field of education.
- 6. Encourage team spirit.
- 7. Demonstrate leadership and exemplify commitment.
- 8. Continue to play an active role in the classroom.
- 9. Commit to fostering deeper learning through empowering all students to make meaningful contributions to the world.
- 10. Maintain their position as principal throughout the 2019-2020 school year.

#### **Nomination Process**

- 1. Nominations may be submitted by teachers, students, former students, parents, administrators or the general public. Principals may not nominate themselves.
- 2. Nomination materials must include:
  - A minimum of four statements of support, one of which must be from a professional educator.
  - A career summary.
  - A description of contributions in each of the nomination criteria.
  - A 200-word biography, written to highlight the specific award for which the awardee was nominated.

#### **Selection**

#### **Public Schools**

Each participating public school system will receive and screen nominations and will select one finalist in accordance with the criteria and nomination process listed here. A selection committee of individuals who represent teachers, administrators, parents, and *The Washington Post* will review nomination materials for each finalist.

Nominations are scored using a standardized rubric. One finalist will be selected as The Washington Post Principal of the Year. The winner will be notified by *The Washington Post* on Monday, March 11, 2019.

Completed Nomination Packets for LCPS principals must be submitted to the address below by **4:30 p.m.**, **Wednesday**, **December 19, 2018**.

Awards will be presented at *The Washington Post* ceremony in the spring.
