




Existing Site Analysis Takeaways

- PVH is 40 acres vs typical 50-60 acre high school site
- Potential use of adjacent Sterling ES site for athletic field
- Potential replacement of stadium and bus parking

Existing Building Analysis Takeaways

- Load bearing walls minimize flexibility during renovation
- Low floor to floor heights
- Minimal natural light into classrooms
- Auditorium does not meet current standard










New Building Option



STUDENT WELCOME CENTER




This project provides funding to design and construct an addition at Sterling Elementary School for a Student Welcome Center. The establishment of a Student Welcome Center in eastern Loudoun will provide more efficient and effective delivery of services to the County's limited English proficient public-school students. The Welcome Center will offer a centralized location in eastern Loudoun for various instructional program registration needs, as well as for instructional and/or pupil services support staff.

The addition to Sterling Elementary School, for the Welcome Center, will total 7500 square feet but will not increase the base capacity of the school. On-site parking will be expanded to accommodate the co-located uses.

SCHOOL SECURITY IMPROVEMENTS



Prior appropriations were approved from FY 2019 - FY 2022, and additional appropriations are requested in FY 2023 and FY 2024, to provide secure vestibules, upgraded intrusion detection systems, and exterior door electronic access locks at schools throughout the County.

Funding will provide enhanced security at school campuses to include: door hardware, electronics and controls at building entries to manage visitor access, additional cameras and AiPhones, modified office configurations, access deterrent measures, and interim secure vestibules to provide enhanced security until permanent work can be completed. Additional enhanced visitor management hardware, controls and access deterrent measures also need to be applied to other facilities that already have the necessary vestibule configuration. Significant interior modifications of office and media center spaces at nine (9) high schools are proposed to better align staff resources with enhanced entry security systems.

SCHOOL BUS REPLACEMENTAND ACQUISITION



This project provides funding for the replacement and acquisition of school buses on an annual basis.


In support of the 2020 Loudoun County School Board resolution on Climate Change, the Division of Transportation began an electric bus pilot program to explore ways to reduce our carbon footprint. LCPS school buses travel over 8 million miles each year and produce over 20 tons of carbon monoxide into the environment. With recent action on climate change and new alternative-fuel products on the market from school bus manufacturers, the LCPS pilot program is designed to test the viability of electric buses to serve our students' transportation needs.

Through a partnership with Dominion Energy, five electric buses have been placed into service and are based (charged) at Park View High School. As part of a 2nd phase of the pilot program, LCPS was recently awarded six (6) electric buses from the Virginia Department of

Environmental Quality, which will be based (charged) at Cardinal Ridge Elementary School and planned for operations in 2022. The pilot program and industry research and monitoring will inform a long-term transportation fleet strategy under development.

LAND ACQUISITION FUND



New school projects are located on sites acquired by proffered conveyance or purchase. When school sites cannot be obtained via proffered conveyance through an approved rezoning, LCPS requests funding to acquire suitable land to develop schools in locations that best serve the County's residents.

Funding is requested to acquire five (5) elementary schools, three (3) middle schools, two (2) high schools, and one (1) support facility during the 30-year CIP from FY 2023 to FY 2052.

Funding for land acquisition is planned up to three (3) years in advance of the commencement of design for school capital projects. Projected residential development in the County's 2019 Comprehensive Plan requires most of the land acquisition funding for new school sites in the first six-years of the CIP. This allows funds to be available early in the CIP to potentially acquire sites before available tracts of land are sold for other purposes.



ENERGY CONSERVATION PROJECTS




The projects focus on energy conservation in all school buildings, to include:

- Replacing lighting on campus with LED fixtures
- Installing Solar Photo-voltaic arrays
- Replacing electrical transformers
- Recommissioning HVAC energy management systems
- Replacing plumbing fixtures with reduced flow fixtures
- Replacing major mechanical systems
- Applying roof coating and sealant

Funding for the projects are provided from FY 2021 – FY 2029. The focus of the planned work is to reduce utility costs at each school over the next 20 years.

FINE ARTS STORAGE IMPROVEMENTS




This project provides funding to:

- Design and construct renovations and /or additions to middle schools (17) and high schools (17) to accommodate additional musical instrument storage space within school buildings. Middle School renovations/additions could provide up to 500 square feet of additional space for musical instrument storage at each school. High school renovations/additions could provide up to 900 square feet of additional space for musical instrument storage at each school.
- Design and construct a 900 square foot building for marching band storage, either attached or detached from the main school building as best suited for each site, adjacent to the designated outdoor marching band practice area at each high school.
- Provide for an outdoor marching band observation tower adjacent to each high schools' designated outdoor marching band practice area.

HIGH SCHOOL PRACTICE FIELDS




Funding will be provided to install athletic field lighting and synthetic turf to ensure all high schools in the County have two lighted, synthetic turf fields.

The installation of synthetic turf and lights will allow teams to extend the amount of time the fields can be in use for high school athletic teams for practices or matches. The additional high school fields will also be used for County Parks and Recreation athletic programs when the fields are not in use by the high schools.

The project will install synthetic turf at the nine (9) high schools in the County that do not already have a practice field with synthetic turf: Loudoun County High School, Broad Run High School, Potomac Falls High School, Heritage High School, Stone Bridge High School, Dominion High School, Briar Woods High School, Freedom High School, and Tuscarora High School. All high schools in the County will have athletic field lighting installed at one practice field per school.

HIGH SCHOOL TENNIS COURT LIGHTING




Beginning in FY 2023, funding is requested to install tennis court lights at each LCPS high school where lights do not currently exist. Lighting improvements will be completed over a three-year period. The installation of lights will allow teams to wait out weather delays, avoid the postponement of matches due to loss of light, and enable students to stay in school for the entire instruction day for regular season matches while still completing full length matches.

The fourteen (14) high schools where lights will be installed include: Briar Woods High School, Broad Run High School, Dominion High School, Freedom High School, Heritage High School, John Champe High School, Loudoun County High School, Loudoun Valley High School, Potomac Falls High School, Riverside High School, Rock Ridge High School, Stone Bridge High School, Tuscarora High School, and Woodgrove High School.

HIGH SCHOOL WEIGHT ROOM EXPANSIONS





LCPS collected \$125,000 in cash proffers from the Sterling Meadow rezoning (ZMAP-2019-0007) towards the weight room expansion at Potomac Falls High School.

The expansions are proposed to accommodate increased participation and team/sport opportunities at the high school level. Current prototype high schools have additional space to address the increased need.

MODULAR CLASSROOM REMOVALS




This project provides funding to remove modular classrooms at schools where the useful life of the modular has been met or exceeded, or where continued maintenance of the modular is cost prohibitive.


RIVER BEND MIDDLE SCHOOL ENTRANCE/DRIVEWAY



The construction of walking tracks at fifteen (15) schools are recommended to enhance the physical education instructional program at schools that currently do not have a track.



UNIFIED COMMUNICATION SYSTEMS



Unified Communication Systems (UC) are the modern replacement for school intercom, public address, paging, and telephone systems. They create a single integrated system to support school communications and safety. UC systems are IP-based and require new cabling as they do not utilize existing speaker or telephone cabling.

Many of the current systems in LCPS are over 20 years old with the oldest equipment still in use from the 1970's. Funding is provided to establish a yearly refresh cycle for the legacy system equipment and to provide additional data cabling to support network-connected UC components.
