1. **Call to Order**

1.01 Welcome by Jeannie Kloman.

2. **Minutes from October 25, 2021 meeting**

2.01 Motion to approve minutes from meeting October 25, 2021 by Allison Hubbard, seconded by Derek Farrey.

3. **Recognitions**

3.01 Kelly Thomas shared a recognition given to Dana Steinberg, RN for medical attention given to a student at one of the high schools.

4. **Information Items**

4.01 Concussion Policy 8445 and Regulation Draft 8445. Dr. Bowers shared Concussion Policy 8445 and Regulation Draft 8445. Time was given to review the Policy and Regulation. The question was made as to why the policy refers to student athletics instead of just students.

4.02 Senate Bill 704. Kelly Thomas shared Bill 704 requires the Superintendent of Public Instruction to, at least annually, survey all local school divisions and use such data to strengthen the comprehensive availability of school health services information. The bill provides that information to be collected in the survey shall include: (i) staffing levels of school health personnel, (ii) the prevalence of students with chronic health conditions, (iii) the percentage of students with health services written in their records, (iv) the number of visits to the school health office and dispositions, (v) health services provided by each school, and (vi) any other information deemed appropriate. The bill requires each local school division to complete each survey.

4.03 Bylaws. Developing operating procedure and bylaws for School Health Advisory Boards. Dr. Bowers shared the Alexandria Public Schools SHAB Bylaws and the Guidelines and Technical Education Advisory Committee Bylaws to review as the committee develops the Loudoun County Public Schools SHAB Bylaws.

5. **New Business**

5.01 Membership Updates - Dr. Judy Hanley has resigned her position with LAWS and the Child Advocacy Center and will need to be replaced. Kirk Dolson has been promoted to Supervisor for High School Education and is no longer a principal. He will need to be replaced by a current principal.

6. **Discussion Items or Community Updates**

6.01 Allison Hubbard shares the Health Department will have less of a roll with the roll out of Pfizer for 6 months to 4 years old. They are looking at programs on how to move forward with contact tracing.

6.02 Dr. McCabe shares they will have vaccines on the Inova campus at Gallows Road. Covid hospitalizations 41 % peak in January. Most of the cases in the 5-11 range that have been hospitalized are unvaccinated. More mental health issues are being seen with students. Dr. McCabe shared that student's having a mental health crisis can be referred to Lansdowne. The Lansdown facility has overnight provisions.

6.03 Jeannie Kloman shared the School Board has passed funding to have registered nurses in elementary school with Medical Disability (MD) programs. Currently, Title 1 elementary school are staffed with registered nurses.
