WHAT IS CAMPUS?



CAMPUS is a high school college access program designed to meet the specific needs of **first-generation** college-bound students.

WHO IS CAMPUS FOR?

Students who are **first-generation college students** (neither parent/guardian has a Bachelor's degree from a U.S. college/university)



HOW IS CAMPUS DELIVERED?



CAMPUS is delivered during student's Study Hall block. Students participate in CAMPUS lessons on academic and college/career preparation as well as have time to complete school work.

WHAT DO WE DO IN CAMPUS?

Students learn about goal setting, time management, self-advocacy, the college application process, financial aid, and more! Students attend college field trips, listen to guest speakers, and engage in college and career exploration.
