### PARENT VOLUNTEERS WANTED: Tuesday, January 29,2015 8:30am - Noon

Reality Store is coming back to Park View on January 29, 2015 and we need your help. Reality Store is a fun, hands-on "real life" simulation for high school seniors. The purpose of this event is to provide students with a "taste" of reality through an educational role-playing simulation relating to making financial choices. Each Senior is given, at random, a career, a salary, and a family life situation. They then visit our booths and make financial decisions on how to make their salary last the month. First stop – taxes, then to the bank to deposit their salary, then the student is required to visit every booth to purchase the things necessary to live. Example of booths include: housing, groceries, clothing, utilities, transportation, medical, child care, clothing, insurance, and entertainment.

Volunteers man these booths. All materials and supplies that explain the expenses for the booth are provided. You will receive a short training in the morning. Your job is to initial the student's brochure that they attended the booth. You can assist the students in considering the different options on how much they will spend, but ultimately they make the final decisions.

### Library Media Center News

A growing body of research indicates that two keys to improving student achievement are increasing teacher collaboration and implementing projects that encourage students to think across disciplines. In an article in the *Stanford Social Innovation Review*, researcher Carrie R. Levana calls teacher collaboration, "The Missing Link in School Reform," and a post on *Edutopia*, from the George Lucas Educational Foundation explains, "Integrated Studies combine curriculum from two or more disciplines, allowing students to see how ideas are connected. Teaching in such a contextual manner promotes collaboration, critical thinking, and knowledge retention."

School librarians long have been advocates of both collaboration and an interdisciplinary approach. We work with teachers to integrate the information skills curriculum into classroom content every day, and as a hub for the school, facilitate collaboration between faculty members on a daily basis.

### Interdisciplinary Collaborations - English 9 and World History I

One recent example involves the ninth-grade students' study of the *Odyssey* in English and Ancient Greece in World History I. Collaborating with the English department and Reading Specialist Dr. Karen Banks, the library participated in creating, presenting and hosting a library-wide, block-long Grecian learning center to provide students with basic vocabulary and background information as they started studying Homer's *Odyssey* and Ancient Greece. Dr. Banks presented key philosophical concepts, geography, and cultural aspects while showing photographs of important places from her travels in the country. Students then broke into groups and moved at intervals to four different activity stations set up throughout the PVHS Library. Stations included:

- Odysseus' Online Journey (a choose- your-own-adventure);
- 2. Puzzles in the Parthenon (crossword, jumble, maze & word search puzzles using vocabulary from the Odyssey and Ancient Greece);
- 3. Digging for the Dead (using an USA Today article called "Ancient sarcophagus unearthed in Cyprus," students drew a picture of what they thought the dig looked like complete with a newspaper caption); and
- 4. Baking Urns (students used the Birmingham Museums and Art Gallery website to create, "fire" and print out Grecian urns, wrote a description of their design and completed a timeline of Ancient Greece).

Stations were designed to improve the students' familiarity with the world of the Ancient Greeks and to build context to deepen their understanding of the *Odyssey*. As the project continued, students tackled essential questions about the *Odyssey* and put group answers on puzzle pieces. The pieces were brought to the library and reassembled into a classic Greek Amphora.

Meanwhile, in World History I classes, the same ninth-grade students studied Ancient Greece. The Social Science Department agreed to jump into this collaboration by synching their instruction about Ancient Greece in order to reinforce students' understanding. They further built on student knowledge and creativity by building Triermes (warships) and sugar cube temples to surround the Amphora Puzzle.

Interdisciplinary Collaborations – Music in the Library

Another type of inter-disciplinary collaboration literally came alive as the library arranged early morning musical concerts in the library throughout late fall and early winter. *World View*, our multicultural ensemble directed by Dr. Miroslav Loncar, played music and sang in many languages to the delight of the growing crowds. Frequently students and faculty in the audience were moved to join in the vocals, pick up instruments and clap hands to the beats and move to the rhythms. Just before the holidays, the Park View Jazz Ensemble, directed by Conniemarie Mahaffey, tuned up their brass instruments to serenade library crowds and celebrate the spirit of the seasons. *Interdisciplinary Collaborations – Core Subjects, ELL, Reading in the Library* 

Yet another example of interdisciplinary cooperation was *Building Bridges with Vocabulary/ Be a Philologist*. This collaborative project between the four core content areas – English, Math, Science and Social Science – and the ELL Department, the Reading Department, the PVHS Library and *World View* musicians. The project involved gathering key vocabulary terms from the four content areas, making word posters and creating t-shirt design using the *Tagxedo Word Clouds* website. ELL and Reading students also wrote a greeting to their home country using key vocabulary. The greetings were then combined to create a music video filmed by *Silent Fire Productions* of New York City. Students each received a copy of the video to share with their families. *Building Bridges with Vocabulary* was celebrated with a breakfast reception for participants in the Library in combination with a concert by Park View's own *World View* musicians performing songs with lyrics that spelled out words (e.g.; R-E-S-P-E-C-T). *Interdisciplinary Collaborations – Reading Across Content Areas* 

Finally, Throughout the year the Park View Library collaborates with the Reading Department to sponsor and promote the Battle of the Books Book Club. Students read books from different genres and different content areas in preparation for a spring county-wide competition. The competition involves answering detailed questions about the book plots in a Jeopardy-type contest. This year, student officers were elected to organize teams of readers to study the books in preparation for the spring competition. Park View traditionally has had greater student involvement than any high school in Loudoun County and this year is no different. We are looking forward to a successful Battle of the Books and lively student enjoyment.

At the Park View Library, we take student achievement very seriously and that is why we constantly look for opportunities to spark and facilitate collaboration between students, among faculty and across the disciplines. Reglas de la asistencia 2014-2015

Todas las notas de salida temprana deben estar en la oficina de asistencia antes de las nueve de la mañana o el padre del estudiante tendrá que entrar a la escuela a recojer el estudiante y a firmar la salida del alumno. NO se aceptan llamadas telefónicas para las salidas tempranas. Si la nota no está en la oficina de asistencia antes de las nueve de la mañana, una nota de permiso puede ser enviada por fax a la escuela para que el estudiante pueda salir temprano. El número de fax de la escuela es 571-434-4501. O pueden mandar un mensaje electrónico a Lynne.Rose@lcps.org o a Linda.Miller@lcps.org.

Para los estudiantes con permiso de salida temprana: cuando hay un horario diferente de lo normal, la salida temprana es basada en el período del día no en el tiempo. Por ejemplo: si el permiso de salida temprana es después del período 7, entonces el estudiante está requirido a estar en la escuela hasta el fin del período. El permiso no está basado en el tiempo.

No se aceptan las razones familiares como una razón justificada para la llegada tarde o salida temprana, a menos que la razón sea escrita específicamente clara.

No se aceptan de haberse levantado tarde ni de haber mucho tráfico como tardanzas justificadas aunque el estudiante tenga una nota escrita del padre.

Salidas tempranas para ir de viaje son sin excusa.

Todas las solicitudes de vacaciones, salidas del país, etc. deben ser presentadas en escritura al director de la escuela, Sr. Dolson para su aprobación. Todas las notas deben ser entregadas en un mínimo de dos semanas antes de la primera ausencia.

Se requiere la documentación apropiada para cualquiera ausencia, tardanza o salida temprana, para ser considerada con excusa. La documentación apropiada se define como una nota del doctor o dentista, sistema judicial o de otros documentos como se considere apropiado. No se aceptan notas de los padres como ausencia justificada.

PARA LOS ATLETAS: Para poder participar en una actividad deportiva o en la práctica de cualquier día, el atleta o gerente debe informar a la escuela hasta las nueve y quince de la mañana y deben permanecer en la escuela todo el día. Se pueden hacer excepciones para las citas del médico o dentista o razones aprovadas por el director de la escuela. Se requiere una nota del médico o dentista para calificar a esta excepción. Por la ley del estado de Virginia sólo las siguientes son razones válidas para llegar tarde: citas médicas o dentales, enfermedad, judicial, o muerte en la familia. Para que una tardanza sea justificada, los padres del estudiante debe llamar o enviar una nota. La nota de los padres NO excusará la cita médica, dental o judicial. Sino el estudiante debe proveer una nota del médico oficial o un documento de la corte para que la tardanza sea justificada.

La salida temprana se permite por enfermedad personal, muerte en la familia, las citas médicas, comparecencias ante el tribunal o las fiestas religiosas. Un estudiante que desee salir de la escuela con una de las razones anteriormente mencionadas, él deberá presentar una nota de su padre a la oficina de asistencia antes de las nueve de la mañana. Si el estudiante se olvida de presentar su nota a la hora designada, el padre debe entrar a la escuela para firmar la salida del estudiante. EN NINGUN CASO LAS LLAMADAS TELEFONICAS SERAN ACEPTADAS. Si el padre se olvida de enviar una nota con el estudiante, tiene que enviarlo por fax o entrar a la escuela.

Esto es para la protección de su estudiante y la administración. Muchas gracias de antemano por su cooperación.

### **Attendance Rules**

2014-2015

All early dismissal notes must be turned into Attendance before 9 am, or the parent/guardian will have to come into the school and sign out the student. Phone calls are **NOT** accepted for early dismissals. If a note is not turned into Attendance before 9 am, a note may be faxed to PVHS in order for the early dismissal to occur. Please fax to 571-434-4501. An email can also be sent to Lynne.Rose@lcps.org, or Linda.Miller@lcps.org.

FOR EARLY RELEASE STUDENTS: When we have a different schedule, your early release is based on the block, not the time. For example: if you have early release after 7<sup>th</sup> block, you are required to stay until the end of that block. It is not based on the time.

Family reasons are not accepted as an excused reason for tardy or early dismissals, unless the reason is specifically stated.

Oversleeping and traffic issues are not accepted as excused tardies even with a note from the parent.

Early dismissals for going out of town are unexcused.

All requests for vacations, going out of the country, etc. must be submitted in writing to Mr. Dolson for approval. All notes must be turned in a minimum of two weeks prior to the first absence.

Proper documentation is required for any absence, tardy, or early dismissal, in order for it to be counted as excused. Proper documentation is defined as a note from the doctor or dentist, court system or other documents as deemed appropriate. Parents' notes are not accepted as excused.

REMINDER TO ATHLETES: In order to participate in an athletic activity or practice on any given day, an athlete or manager must report to school by 9:15 am and must remain in school the entire day. Exceptions may be made for doctor or dental appointments or reasons excused by the principal. A doctor/dental note is required for this exception.

By Virginia state law only the following are valid reasons to be tardy: medical or dental appointments, illness, judicial, or death in the immediate family. In order for a tardy to be excused, a student's parent/guardian must call in the tardy or send in a note. A parent note will NOT excuse a medical, dental, or judicial appointment. The student must provide an official physician or court document in order for the tardy to be excused.

An early dismissal may be granted for personal illness, death in the family medical appointments, court appearances or religious holidays. A student wishing to leave school grounds for one of the above reasons must present a note from his/her parent to the Attendance Office before 9:00 am. If a student forgets to present their note at the designated time, the parent must come into the school to sign the student out. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES WILL CALL-INS BE ACCEPTED. If a parent forgets to send a note in with the student, he/she must fax a note or come into the school.
