

The Principal's Points

It is hard to believe that we have completed our first full month of school. As they say, time flies when you're having fun! I can honestly say that this is the case for me. This first month as the Principal of Park View has been fun and exciting. I am enjoying the opportunity to meet many of you and your students at the various student activities I attend. Moreover, it is especially rewarding building relationships with the students both inside and outside of the classroom. I look forward to those important interactions continuing. Students are engaging in lessons that inspire and intrigue them. Learning is extending beyond the walls of PVHS. As in anything that we do, we are always striving to improve our practices. Specifically, as a staff, we are focusing on the rigor we ask students to engage in on a daily basis. The level of instruction that we provide your students complements the rigors of the end of course assessments that students take in the spring. Teachers are planning collaboratively and evaluating students using common forms of assessment in order to provide instructional experiences that will increase students' content mastery. As partners in education, parents can assist the school by ensuring that students complete all assignments outside of school and that students seek assistance from teachers here at Park View when they are struggling. Many teachers make themselves available during, before, and after school to assist students.

One of the most effective ways to positively affect your student's achievement is to be involved in the school. At Park View, there are a variety of opportunities that you can take to become involved in the school and your student's education. Please let us know if you're interested in volunteering your time to assist us in continuing to improve all of the programs that we offer at PVHS. We continue to make strides in increasing the rigor in our classrooms. I ask that you assist teachers in ensuring that students are engaging in academic work outside of school. It is especially important that students complete homework or other tasks assigned to be completed outside of school as these activities are practice and help teachers gauge where students are in the learning

Similarly, communication between us (the school and the family) must be a priority. We have attempted to mprove our school calendar on the PVHS website detailing many (NOT ALL) of the activities that occur at Park View. Our hope is that you find the information that you are seeking on this calendar. If you do not, please let one of our main office staff know. Another form of communication between the school and the home comes in the form of students' grades. The CLARITY parent portal will be open on October 1, 2014. In order to access this portal, you must fill out the proper paperwork and allow us to enter your information into the system. If you have not done so already, you may obtain a copy of the CLARITY access form on the PVHS web page. This form can then be given to Mrs. Lynne Rose, Attendance Secretary, Park View High School. You may scan the letter and email it directly to Mrs. Rose, or simply bring the form to PVHS and turn it in to

If you have any questions or concerns about your student's grades, please contact the teacher first. Teachers can offer explanations about specific assignments that others cannot. The most efficient method to contact a teacher is via email as teachers' availability during the school day vary.

full Park View High School Community.



Young Women's Group: Focuses on self-esteem, healthy relationships, healthy body image and peer pressure issues. **Pre-recovery Group**: For students currently experimenting with drugs or alcohol and could benefit from learning about their effects physically, mentally and socially.

Recovery Group: To assist students recovering from alcohol and drug abuse.

COA (Children of Alcoholics and/or Addicts): For students who have a family member that has currently or in the past battled alcohol and/or drug abuse.

Grief – For students who have recently lost a loved one.

Pregnancy – To support students who are pregnant or have children.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) the Enterovirus D68 (EV-D68) is a non-polio enterovirus that was first identified in the United States over 50 years ago. Cases have recently been confirmed in several states. EV-D68 causes respiratory illness and the virus can be found in respiratory secretions such as saliva, nasal mucus, or sputum. It can be spread from person to person when an infected person coughs, sneezes, or touches surfaces and contaminates them.

Mild symptoms of the disease may include fever, runny nose, sneezing, cough, skin rash, mouth blisters, and body and muscle aches. There are no anti-viral medications currently available to treat the EV-D68 infection, so **thorough hand-washing continues to be the most effective deterrent to illness**, followed by avoiding touching eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands. In addition, avoidance of kissing, hugging, and sharing cups or utensils with someone who is sick is important.

Who? ... What? ... When?

The Family Life Education classes will be starting on October 2nd at Park View High School. To find out more about the FLE teacher, Dana Clark, and information concerning this subject, just click on **STAFF** on the school website (http://www.lcps.org/pvhs) and then click on Clark, Dana - Family Life Education. This will take you directly to the FLE page. By simply clicking on School's FLE **Schedule** (in the column to the left), you will be sent to a calendar section where you can find when the students for each Health/PE teacher will be having FLE instruction. There may be reasons for the schedule to change (i.e. school closings, teacher illness, etc.), but any changes will be reflected at this calendar site. The ninth graders will be having FLE during the first semester. Tenth graders will have class during the second semester.

Even though OPT-OUT FORMS were due on September 12th, a parent/guardian may at any point decide to opt their child out of the program ... or certain SOLs. The opposite is, also, true. Should someone decide that they want their child opted back in, a note from home making this request (with student's name, statement of intent, and parent's/guardian's signature) is all that is needed. Phone calls will not be sufficient.

Library Media Center New

It's important for students to pass their SOL tests, both as individuals and for the school community. Studies conducted for the past two decades have demonstrated that students perform better on standardized reading assessments when their school includes a certified librarian. This is true regardless of the income level of the students. Park View is fortunate to have two professional librarians, as well as a library assistant. Other characteristics associated with better test scores include teachers that collaborate with librarians, librarians that teach information literacy skills, and libraries that are open before and after school. You will find all of these and more--at the PVHS Library. (For more information on the studies mentioned in this article, please visit: http://www.lrs.org/data-tools/school-libraries/impactstudies/.)

Before school started, Park View teachers and librarians working together to plan engaging learning activities for students. The first day of school the library was bustling with students who came in to use computers and check out books. The second week of school seniors began researching career opportunities, and other students came to the library to learn about the Alexandria information portal, see book trailers and hear about great new books. In late September, 9th grade students reported for Information Skills Basic Training, and were sent on a number of missions to inform themselves and their classmates about locating and using quality information and digital citizenship.

In the research studies, increased student visits to the library are also correlated with higher student achievement. The Park View Library staff entices students to visit the library in a number of ways. The observance of Banned Books Week September 22-26 invited students to think about the importance of the freedom to read, a right which is far from universal. October 14-17 we will be celebrating Teen Read Week, with the theme, "Turn Dreams into Reality." The goal of Teen Read Week is to spotlight the ways libraries can help students succeed in school and beyond. As part of Teen Read Week, PVHS Library will host the fifteenth annual Rock 'n' Read-a-Thon on Friday, October 17. Students and staff will gather in the hallway outside the library to enjoy a few minutes rocking, reading, relaxing *and* munching on Oreos. Feel free to join the fun!

Finally, newer and larger school library collections have also been shown to correlate with better student achievement. We truly appreciate all the teachers and parents who sponsored a magazine at the Tree of Knowledge Fundraiser during Back-to-School night. Your contribution will help get current, relevant reading material into the hands of our students. Thank you.

Reglas de la asistencia 2014-2015

Todas las notas de salida temprana deben estar en la oficina de asistencia antes de las nueve de la mañana o el padre del estudiante tendrá que entrar a la escuela a recojer el estudiante y a firmar la salida del alumno. NO se aceptan llamadas telefónicas para las salidas tempranas. Si la nota no está en la oficina de asistencia antes de las nueve de la mañana, una nota de permiso puede ser enviada por fax a la escuela para que el estudiante pueda salir temprano. El número de fax de la escuela es 571-434-4501. O pueden mandar un mensaje electrónico a Lynne.Rose@lcps.org o a Linda.Miller@lcps.org.

Para los estudiantes con permiso de salida temprana: cuando hay un horario diferente de lo normal, la salida temprana es basada en el período del día no en el tiempo. Por ejemplo: si el permiso de salida temprana es después del período 7, entonces el estudiante está requirido a estar en la escuela hasta el fin del período. El permiso no está basado en el tiempo.

No se aceptan las razones familiares como una razón justificada para la llegada tarde o salida temprana, a menos que la razón sea escrita específicamente clara.

No se aceptan de haberse levantado tarde ni de haber mucho tráfico como tardanzas justificadas aunque el estudiante tenga una nota escrita del padre.

Salidas tempranas para ir de viaje son sin excusa.

Todas las solicitudes de vacaciones, salidas del país, etc. deben ser presentadas en escritura al director de la escuela, Sr. Dolson para su aprobación. Todas las notas deben ser entregadas en un mínimo de dos semanas antes de la primera ausencia.

Se requiere la documentación apropiada para cualquiera ausencia, tardanza o salida temprana, para ser considerada con excusa. La documentación apropiada se define como una nota del doctor o dentista, sistema judicial o de otros documentos como se considere apropiado. No se aceptan notas de los padres como ausencia justificada.

PARA LOS ATLETAS: Para poder participar en una actividad deportiva o en la práctica de cualquier día, el atleta o gerente debe informar a la escuela hasta las nueve y quince de la mañana y deben permanecer en la escuela todo el día. Se pueden hacer excepciones para las citas del médico o dentista o razones aprovadas por el director de la escuela. Se requiere una nota del médico o dentista para calificar a esta excepción. Por la ley del estado de Virginia sólo las siguientes son razones válidas para llegar tarde: citas médicas o dentales, enfermedad, judicial, o muerte en la familia. Para que una tardanza sea justificada, los padres del estudiante debe llamar o enviar una nota. La nota de los padres NO excusará la cita médica, dental o judicial. Sino el estudiante debe proveer una nota del médico oficial o un documento de la corte para que la tardanza sea justificada.

La salida temprana se permite por enfermedad personal, muerte en la familia, las citas médicas, comparecencias ante el tribunal o las fiestas religiosas. Un estudiante que desee salir de la escuela con una de las razones anteriormente mencionadas, él deberá presentar una nota de su padre a la oficina de asistencia antes de las nueve de la mañana. Si el estudiante se olvida de presentar su nota a la hora designada, el padre debe entrar a la escuela para firmar la salida del estudiante. EN NINGUN CASO LAS LLAMADAS TELEFONICAS SERAN ACEPTADAS. Si el padre se olvida de enviar una nota con el estudiante, tiene que enviarlo por fax o entrar a la escuela.

Attendance Rules

2014-2015

All early dismissal notes must be turned into Attendance before 9 am, or the parent/guardian will have to come into the school and sign out the student. Phone calls are **NOT** accepted for early dismissals. If a note is not turned into Attendance before 9 am, a note may be faxed to PVHS in order for the early dismissal to occur. **Please fax to 571-434-4501**. An email can also be sent to Lynne.Rose@lcps.org, or Linda.Miller@lcps.org.

FOR EARLY RELEASE STUDENTS: When we have a different schedule, your early release is based on the block, not the time. For example: if you have early release after 7th block, you are required to stay until the end of that block. It is not based on the time.

Family reasons are not accepted as an excused reason for tardy or early dismissals, unless the reason is specifically stated.

Oversleeping and traffic issues are not accepted as excused tardies even with a note from the parent.

Early dismissals for going out of town are unexcused.

All requests for vacations, going out of the country, etc. must be submitted in writing to Mr. Dolson for approval. All notes must be turned in a minimum of two weeks prior to the first absence.

Proper documentation is required for any absence, tardy, or early dismissal, in order for it to be counted as excused. Proper documentation is defined as a note from the doctor or dentist, court system or other documents as deemed appropriate. Parents' notes are not accepted as excused.

REMINDER TO ATHLETES: In order to participate in an athletic activity or practice on any given day, an athlete or manager must report to school by 9:15 am and must remain in school the entire day. Exceptions may be made for doctor or dental appointments or reasons excused by the principal. A doctor/dental note is required for this exception.

By Virginia state law only the following are valid reasons to be tardy: medical or dental appointments, illness, judicial, or death in the immediate family. In order for a tardy to be excused, a student's parent/guardian must call in the tardy or send in a note. A parent note will NOT excuse a medical, dental, or judicial appointment. The student must provide an official physician or court document in order for the tardy to be excused.

An early dismissal may be granted for personal illness, death in the family medical appointments, court appearances or religious holidays. A student wishing to leave school grounds for one of the above reasons must present a note from his/her parent to the Attendance Office before 9:00 am. If a student forgets to present their note at the designated time, the parent must come into the school to sign the student out. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES WILL CALL-INS BE ACCEPTED. If a parent forgets to send a note in with the student, he/she must fax a note or come into the school.
