

## **Class of 2015 Hall of Fame Remarks**

### **Tom Locascio**

As a 2 sport athlete at Park View, Tom Locascio participated in football and track during his time at Park View High School. Tom's contribution to the young Patriot football program laid the foundation for the future success of our teams. He helped lead the football team to the first District championship in 1978 in only the 3<sup>rd</sup> year of existence for Park View High School. The 1980 Patriot football team not only won the District, but went on to win their first Region championship title and was a state runner up.

Tom's hard work garnered recognition as the only AA player to be named to the Washington Star All Suburban 1<sup>st</sup> Team. In addition, he was the first of several Patriot football players to be selected to play in the VHSCA All Star Football Game. During his football career, he was also selected to the All District, All Region and All State teams as well as being named to the Washington Post All Met team.

As a member of the Track and Field program, Tom again helped led the young Patriots to District Championships in 1980 and 1981. The team success also brought home a Regional Championship in 1980 and a runner up title in 1981. Tom competed in the Shot Put and placed 4<sup>th</sup> in the state with a throw of 51 feet and 11 inches. In addition to participating in Shot Put and Discus, he is a current Park View record holder for the 800 M Relay Team with a time of 1:32.2 from 1981.

After his successful career in high school, Tom attended Concord College and was a two year starter on defense during this time. Tom is currently a member of the Sterling Park community and has worked for 22 years as a rural carrier for the United States Post Office in Great Falls, Virginia.

We are proud of his accomplishments both on and off the field and are proud to have him as a member of our Hall of Fame.

## Chris Pack

Chris Pack was an athlete that contributed greatly to the Patriot Soccer team success from 1980-1984. As a 4 year letter winner in soccer, Chris led the Patriots to the District Championship for all 4 years at PVHS. There was no Region or State competition at the time. Individually, he was named to the All-District 1<sup>st</sup> team for 3 years. Chris led the Patriot soccer team in scoring for 3 years and at the time of his graduation, he was the leading scorer in PV history with 70 goals scored in a career. His hard work on the field was also recognized with being named the MVP for Soccer for 3 years and receiving the Coach's Award as a freshman.

Former classmate, Jim Pangburn, reflects on Chris Pack and why he nominated him for the Hall of Fame: "I nominated Christopher (Chris) Pack (Class of 1984) for the Hall of Fame because he was well-known as the best soccer player in the area in the 1980s. At a time when the Virginia High School League (VHSL) did not have All-Region or All-State honors, Chris achieved some of the highest awards available at the time"

Chris's success did not end with his graduation from Park View High School. He attended Mary Washington University and played soccer for all 4 years. As a 4 year starter, he led the Eagles in scoring for 2 out of 4 seasons and scored 45 goals with 25 assists for his career. Once again Chris was rewarded for his play by being named All Region and All State in both his junior and senior year at Mary Washington. In addition to being selected as the MVP in his junior year, Chris was a team captain of the successful Eagle program that played in 2 NCAA tournaments and was ranked 19<sup>th</sup> in the nation in 1988.

Chris is currently a Network Engineer with the Federal Government and lives in Ashburn. He has continued his love of soccer by being a youth soccer coach in his community. Chris has also been active in the little league basketball and football programs.

Park View High School is proud of Chris and his contributions to soccer during his time as a Patriot.

## Theresa Robbins

As a freshman for the Lady Patriots basketball team, Theresa “C.C.” Robbins made an impact from the moment she entered the PV gymnasium. Her basketball coach Anne Brooks writes in her letter of nomination: “When Park View High School opened its doors, everyone in Sterling Park was excited. One young lady who had spent hours shooting baskets with her older brother and playing in recreational leagues could not wait to try out and then play for the basketball team. To be a Patriot and to play basketball was all she cared about. With her hours of practice, her excellent outside shot and her determination, (Theresa) C. C. Robbins made the varsity team as a freshman. Further, she made an important contribution in every varsity game not only her freshman year, but all four years in high school.”

Theresa went on to letter all 4 years on the Varsity Basketball team and scored a career high of 1558 points including 639 points during her senior year. Her hard work was recognized by being named to the Northwestern All District team for 3 years and the All Region II team for 2 years. After her graduation from Park View, she held the record for Most Points, Assists and Most Points in a Game (43) until 1996 when fellow Hall of Famer Renee Lettington broke these records.

In addition to her contributions to the basketball program, Theresa lettered for 3 years in Softball and was selected to the 2<sup>nd</sup> team All District team. After softball, she continued her athletic career on the Track and Field team where she became a district qualifier in the high jump.

Theresa attended George Mason University on a full 4 year tuition scholarship. After college, she began a teaching career in Loudoun County Public Schools where she recently retired after 30 years of service as a 6<sup>th</sup> grade Social Studies teacher. After graduation from George Mason, she continued her love of sports while in LCPS having been a JV Basketball coach and an assistant Softball coach at Broad Run High School.

Coach Anne Brooks speaks of her contribution to PV Basketball: “She was a standout player and helped put Park View High School girls’ basketball on the map.”

Those of us at Park View from 1976-1980 couldn’t agree more.

## Laura Treanor

Laura was an excellent athlete during her years here at Park View having earned letters in Softball, Soccer and Gymnastics. It is a rare occasion in the history of our school that athletes participate and excel in 3 sports during their high school career. Laura Treanor was one of these exceptional athletes.

As an All District selection, Captain and Most Valuable Player for the 1981 softball team, she helped lead the Patriots to their 1<sup>st</sup> of our many district championships in 1980 and again in 1981. Laura continues to leave a mark on Park View softball history as she is the current record holder in 3 categories and has held these records for more than 36 years; records that will remain active for many years to come.

Her softball coach, Beth Walker, reflects on Laura in her letter of recommendation: "Laura Treanor was an integral part of the overall success in the beginning of Park View athletics. She set a standard of commitment and dedication that was important for a new school beginning its traditions of excellence."

Laura continued her athletic success as a member of the gymnastics team by lettering for 3 years and competing in Floor Exercise and Vault. The Patriots gymnast dynasty began with the 1980 team winning the District and Regional Championships and placing 3<sup>rd</sup> in the state.

Gymnastics coach, Kathleen Dugger, writes in her recommendation letter for Laura: "Laura was a student and athlete that sticks in your mind. She was at Park View in its formative years and was a leader through example. Laura was a physically skilled athlete but her impact went far beyond the physical. She led through example."

Laura Treanor's athletic ability and leadership was also evident on the Soccer field for PVHS. She lettered 2 years as Goalie and was selected to the All District team. Once again, Laura was selected as the Most Valuable Player for Soccer and helped lead the Patriots to their first Soccer District championship in 1981.

Her teammate and nominator, Darlene Eamigh Campbell in her letter writes: "Laura was the consummate female athlete...someone the rest of us aspired to emulate. When I think of the outstanding female athlete at Park View during 1980 and 1981, I think of Laura Treanor."
