Julia was an excellent athlete during her years here at Park View having participated in, basketball, swimming and softball, lettering in the last two.

Arguably, Julia's best sport was softball. A member and letter winner for all four years, Julia's softball coach, Beth Walker says: "As the only freshman on our State Championship team in 2002, Julia was instrumental in our success." Coach Walker says that the highlight of Julia's career occurred when she recovered a passed ball in the 14th inning of the State Championship game and was able to tag out the runner at the plate that would have tied the game for us."

Not only was Julia's talent undisputable, but also her stamina. Julia was the starting catcher for every inning in every game during her four year career at Park View. Furthermore, during her junior and senior seasons, Julia maintained a remarkable perfect fielding average, recording absolutely no errors. Her fellow teammate at Park View and at JMU, Megan Smith, reflects on her impact to our program: "Her presence behind the plate gave Karie, our pitcher, added confidence and helped to solidify our defense. Not only did Julia bring energy to the plate, she brought power to our lineup. Julia jumped right in a freshman and became a threat in the lineup."

Julia received many honors during her four year career, deservedly so, including being named All District Catcher for 3 years and All Region for 2 years. She was named to the Washington Post All Met team for 3 years, and was selected MVP for the softball team during her junior and senior seasons. Julia was also a member of the District Champion 2002 and 2003 teams, the 2003 Regional Championship team, the 2003 State Runner-up team and the 2002 State Championship team.

After high school, Julia received a 4 year scholarship to play softball for James Madison University, where she was the starting catcher for 4 years. Julia was a member of the Dukes' 1st CAA championship team and named to the all conference team. After her college career, Julia held single season records in home runs and hit by pitch and walks; she held career records in RBI's and hit by pitch and walks.

Julia currently lives in Ashburn and works as a software engineer and web developer. In her spare time, Julia continues to give back to her community through coaching little leaguers.

Teammate Karie Morrison best sums up Julia's career: "Julia was never boastful or arrogant; she simply had a lot of Patriot pride and loved to play the game.

Currently, Judy resides in Winchester and volunteers at the Habitat for Humanity ReStore.

While there are many examples of their strength as a team, none is more shining than when they competed in both the Harrisonburg Invitational and the Washington-Lee Invitational on the same day. Five representatives from this team, Aleisha Martin, Lynn Peterson, Lisa Zuraw, Lia Silva and Laura Custer all participated in the state meet that year as well. This team is also represented in the Hall of Fame by Lisa Zuraw and Gen Cummings Petrella.

They also had great support from Mr. Andy Peterson and Ms. Cheryl Wimer. These teachers provided coaching, driving, scorekeeping and tutoring before practice. In addition was the presence of Mrs. Bibb, assistant principal at Park View, and who was often accompanied by Mr. Bibb, assistant superintendent for Loudoun County.
