



What Factors Does LCPS Consider When Making Decisions to Close or Delay Schools Due to Inclement Weather?



LCPS staff monitor weather forecasts, consult with the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office and VDOT about road conditions and drive roads throughout the county before decisions about closing school or delays.

LCPS communicates about inclement weather via Blackboard Connect phone calls, emails, Facebook, Twitter, the LCPS website, Loudoun Alerts and local media.

LCPS staff check the condition of buses and school campuses to determine their safety in cold temperatures.



Decisions must be made in anticipation of forecasted weather. It is far more dangerous to wait until inclement weather arrives. Sometimes weather events do not develop as predicted.

Loudoun is 521 square miles divided into two distinct climate zones. While conditions at your house may not be especially bad, they may be treacherous in another area.
