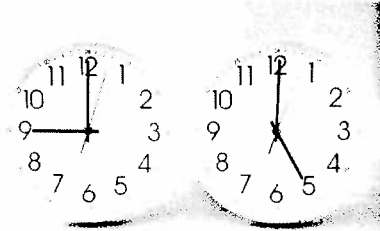

Buenos días.

Buenas noches.

How to talk to different people:



= Señor (sr.)



= Señora (sra.)



(Srta.)  
= Señorita

What's the difference?

IN GENERAL:

Señora > 30 years old.

Señora = married

Señora = has kids

How can we determine if we use "tú" or "usted"?

Informal	Formal
younger / Family and Friends	older / respect

Would you use tú or usted for the following people:

Mr. Chi/Mr. Thompson: usted

The Prince of Spain: usted

Justin Bieber: Tú

Your best friend: tú

Miss Bubb: Tú / usted

Your grandparents: Tú / usted

A waiter or waitress: usted

Your dentist: Tú / usted
