

**Addendum (January 28, 2019) to
Community Information Meeting Questions
Loudoun County High School
January 23, 2019
TLSE 2018-0008, LCPS School at CS Monroe Property**

Since the posting of the January 23, 2019, Community Meeting summary LCPS staff has obtained additional information on the following questions:

8. When does LCPS review the site for safety and security measures? Will there be patrolling of the facility both during the day and the night?

LCPS Safety and Security staff review the site layout as well as the building design. LCPS security staff visit all public schools on a routine basis. The Safety and Security staff is involved in all aspects of school planning and operation to provide a safe and secure environment for our school community.

Douglass School currently has and will continue to have a designated School Resource Officer (SRO).

23. When do you put a security plan together for this property?

Construction begins working with Security and Safety staff at the design phase of the project and continues working with the Safety and Security Office throughout the process and ultimate operation.

Additional Security Information:

All new LCPS facilities are designed with a secure vestibule that consists of electronic access security systems, visitor management systems and intrusion detection systems. Architects and engineers also utilize the campus standards established through the Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) program as a guide for all school designs. Additionally, all LCPS high schools have a School Security Officer, SSO (LCPS employee) and a School Resource Officer, SRO (Loudoun County Deputy Sheriff/Leesburg Police Officer) assigned to the school during school hours. LCPS also employs Security Patrols that respond to alarm service calls and emergency calls after hours.

16. Will the new landscaping be native species?

At the meeting LCPS staff stated that the new landscaping would be native species. This is being confirmed with our landscape consultant and will be updated.

Our landscaping consultant has advised that the plants included in the submitted Landscape Plan (Sheets 14 and 16 of the Special Exception Plat) have been selected from The Town of Leesburg's 'Tree Selection and Cover Guide' and includes native as well as non-native species. Approximately 35% of the proposed species are Virginia native. The species that are non-native are included in the Town's Guide and are neither invasive nor harmful to the environment and ecology.
