Roles & Responsibilities of the Volunteer

The Volunteer

- 1. Brings his/her talents and expertise to the classroom in order that the educational climate may be enriched
- 2. Remembers that a school program has specific goals and volunteers are there to assist the staff in accomplishing those goals
- 3. Respects the confidentiality of anything seen or heard (never gossips about in-school observations)
- 4. Remembers that the program functions best when all concerned have a share in its development (suggestions for improving the program and comments concerning the success of the program should be shared with the volunteer coordinator)
- 5. Assists, when asked to do so, in planning the volunteer program
- 6. Is a dependable and concerned person who feels that the time spent volunteering is a positive investment for the future of all our young people
- 7. Arrives and departs promptly as scheduled (the dependable volunteer keeps in mind that the teacher has planned for his/her arrival and is depending on him/her)
- 8. Reports a cancellation or change in plans promptly to the teacher or other designee
- 9. Remembers that it is the teacher who is responsible for the discipline of the class (the volunteer is there to supplement, not supplant, the teacher's work)
- 10. Helps in the program evaluation so that it may continue to benefit all concerned
- 11. Maintains an interest and takes pleasure in working with children and holds the belief that all children can learn
