Teaching Technology:

DIGITAL CITIZENSHIP


For January, we will look at *Stand up to Cyberbullying*.

According to www.stopbullying.gov, "Cyberbullying is bullying that takes place using electronic technology. Electronic technology includes devices and equipment such as cell phones, computers, and tablets as well as communication tools including social media sites, text messages, chat, and websites.

Examples of cyberbullying include mean text messages or emails, rumors sent by email or posted on social networking sites, and embarrassing pictures, videos, websites, or fake profiles."

Remember; bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior among school aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. The behavior is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time.

With the increased availability of digital devices, we are becoming more aware of this increased threat to our little ones.



In school, we teach our students to stand up to "regular" bullies by telling them to "Stop, Walk, Talk & ENOUGH!". This is the same message that I gave students regarding cyberbullying.


The scary part of cyberbullying is that now bullies don't need to have a face, and can cower behind the face of technology. They no longer have to face their victim. Mean sentiments can be stated anonymously and from anywhere in the world. Not only can bullies do this, but it is extremely difficult to remove all comments, videos or photos once they go viral.


So what are parents to do? Simple steps such as:

- being aware of what websites your child is visiting can help deter them from visiting websites that expose them from websites with chat rooms or other areas that expose them to potential bullies.
- have a list of all passwords to sites your child visits. Making sure that your child knows that you will access their accounts when you feel the need to is a great guideline to set from the beginning.

Lastly, know what to do if your child IS being bullied online. <u>Stopbullying.gov</u> outlines steps to take. Also know that each <u>state has guidelines</u> to follow.









First grade is finishing up their warm and cool colored paintings. Students learned about the warm and cool colors and created two watercolor paintings using each group of colors. We then cut up our paintings so we could weave the two together. Up next we will be jumping into clay. Students will be learning how to manipulate clay with their hands to turn it into a frog. We will learn how to create a pinch pot, coils, as well as creating a slab. Be sure to check out Artsonia for updated photos of our work.

The second graders are working on their oil pastel landscapes. Students are learning how to blend oil pastels to create a night time landscape scene. We talked about how to blend the colors together and how atmospheric perspective changes the appearance of colors in a piece. We will then be cutting our drawings up and turning them into a puzzle. Be sure to keep a look out for photos of these finished pieces!

Third grade is working finishing up their one line owl drawings. We learned how to use a sharpie to draw an image using one line and not lifting our marker up off of the page until we were finished. We are completing the piece by either color with crayons, markers or colored pencils or using watercolors. Be sure to check out Artsonia for updated images of student work. Up next we will be creating a watercolor landscape.

The fourth graders are finishing up their gargoyle pieces. They have all been fired and we are working on painting them to look like stone. When they are finished they will be displayed at school in the showcase outside the art room and photos will be taken of them and posted on Artsonia. Once these are finished we will continue to work on our abstract pumpkins, creating value with tempera paints.

Fifth grade is working on creating tessellations. We took a look at some of the first tessellations that were created and looked at works by M.C. Escher. Students got to see what tessellations are and how to create one of their own. We have just finished creating our stencil and students are currently working on finishing their piece with crayons, markers, colored pencils or paint. Be sure to check out our Artsonia page to see the finished works! If your child is in 5th grade and would like to participate in the poster contest for the 5th grade play please have them grab an information sheet outside of the art room for further information.

There is also another art contest for students to participate in. It is through David Ramadan: The contest rules state that artwork can be submitted to the art room no later than Tuesday January 6^{th} . (I need to have the artwork turned it by January 7^{th}). The other requirements are that the artwork be no more than 11 x 17 in size and have your name, grade and school of each student. The artwork will be returned at the end of March. If you are chosen as a winner, your artwork will be sent to the Capitol to be displayed and there will be a reception with invitations extended to parents.
