This Literacy Resources Flyer was made to support children with dyslexia, growing readers, and their caregivers. It is updated every 6 months and includes resources for kids and support for families.

Summer is a time to play, explore and recharge, but also requires a healthy balance of academic maintenance and growth. Tutoring and enrichment classes, as well as reading (high interest, decodable books, audiobooks, read-to-me, etc.) daily, are critical to maintaining learned skills. This flyer suggests supplemental activities such as apps, websites, podcasts, etc. that you can explore with your child. The suggestions range from pre-k materials to middle/high school and are Science of Reading aligned.

For audiobooks or passages, students can listen to higher leveled books to enhance their fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension.

Summer is also an ideal time to work on keyboarding and handwriting skills and listen to podcasts on the road.
