Jeff Morse is an 11-year resident of South Riding and is the Dulles District School Board Representative. Jeff grew up in Vienna, graduated from Virginia Tech, and was commissioned an ensign in the U.S. Navy. He served on active duty for 20 years, retiring as a commander in 2006. Jeff qualified as a Surface Warfare Officer, serving on a frigate, a cruiser, and an aircraft carrier and deploying four times to the Persian Gulf, including Operations Earnest Will and Desert Storm.

Ashore, he was a master instructor at the United States Naval Academy, a project manager for several classified advanced weapon systems and, in his final billet, the director, Navy Displays, Processors and Navigation Systems for ships and submarines.

In addition to his bachelor of science in business management from Virginia Tech, Jeff earned a master of science in business finance from the University of Maryland (UMUC) while graduating first in his class, a master of arts in National Security and Strategic Studies from the U.S. Naval War College, graduating with distinction, and a one-year Harvard Fellowship.

Jeff is a lead associate for Booz Allen Hamilton, supporting the federal government in managing and procuring technology and services. He is a Department of Defense acquisition professional, a Defense Acquisition Workforce Improvement Act (DAWIA) Level III program manager, a Project Management Institute (PMI) certified project management professional (PMP) and a member of Mensa.

He was also director for the Dulles South Neighbors for Education before his election to the School Board.
