  - The fee has gone up from \$150/165 to \$250; Ashley will send a formal request to lower the cost.
- SEAC- Todd Fielding
  - Tedra Richardson, Director of Special Education, lead the SEAC meeting.
  - She reported that there are 9,351 students eligible for special education services in LCPS, with 2,195 eligible at the middle school level (or 11.5%) of the total student population.
  - Brambleton Middle School is 22% over capacity and a new middle school is being built nearby.
  - SPED passing rates on SOL's are all above state averages at the district level.
    - 40% Reading
    - 45% Math
    - 42% Writing
    - 48% Science
    - 53% Social Studies

- Efforts will continue to be made to reduce the achievement gap between SPED students and the general population.
- There are more than **50** TA and teaching vacancies in SPED still open.
